Abstract

Proposal for a cooperative effort from the City and Government of Paderborn, Germany for the Victims/Survivors of Typhoon Yolanda of Barotac Viejo, through the intercession of the Spouses James and Rochelle Jones, residents of Paderborn with the help of Herr Stefan Beyhoff (Paderborn am Sonntag) in coordination with Lions Club, Inc. of Iloilo and University of Iloilo-College of Law & In Solidum Frasority for the survivors of Typhoon Haiyan in Barotac Viejo, Iloilo (150 families plus, 7000 people currently at-risk) and immediate locality.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS: TO BE IMMEDIATELY DISTRIBUTED FOR URGENT SURVIVOR RELIEF

Estimated Total: P 287,700 or €5,150

1. 100 Water Purifiers to be distributed to 100 needy families or family-clusters (so they can share)

Estimated Price: P 1, 300 + x 100 = P 130, 000 (on discount from local supplier)

2. 600 galvanized iron sheets plus roofing nails to be given to 150 families in Brgy. Poblacion

Estimated Price: P 700 (4 G.I. Sheets plus nails) x 150 = P 105,000

3. 150 relief goods consisting of 2 kilos of rice, 7 noodles packs, 7 canned goods, medicine, candles & matches, temporary plastic sheeting, used blankets and used clothes to be given to identified needy families in Brgy. Nueva Invencion currently housed in the remote village school (good for 1 week)

Estimated Price: P 150 x P 250 = P 37, 500.00

4. 150 solar powered lamps for 150 families

Estimated Price per box= 8 pcs @ P 800 x 19 = P 15,200.00

SHORT TERM/LONG TERM PROJECT: REHABILITATION OF RAUL O. V. CAUSING MEMORIAL SCHOOL

Barotac Viejo's central elementary school currently serving as refugee shelter & aid dispersal center

Estimated Total: P 500,000 or €8,950

- 1. Fund Source Fund raised through the City of Paderborn/Paderborn Help
- 2. Specific Objective/s:
 - To repair/replace the blown-away roofs of certain classrooms currently serving as shelter - urgent
 - To repair/replace the torn-off ceilings of identified classrooms urgent
 - To repair/replace classroom dividing walls urgent
 - To paint the said roofs and ceilings vital but not immediate
 - To re-tile the floors vital but not immediate
 - To provide/replace educational materials & classroom furniture: books, tables & chairs vital but not immediate
 - To purchase relief generator for temporary medical center & aid dispersal center as well as to allow survivors to charge mobile phones
- 3. Estimated Budget for urgent shelter/classroom repair: P 400, 000.00 or €7,150
- Estimated Budget for purchase of books, classroom furniture & generator : P 100,000.00 or €1,800
- 5. Target Classrooms: 10 classrooms needing specific repairs (see #3 above)
- 6. Period for accomplishment: 3 weeks

PROPOSED LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM FOR RECOVERY

Estimated Total: (to follow, research currently being undertaken)

- 1. Piggery to help surviving families by installing a piggery cooperative for the purpose of economic recovery (details to follow)
- 2. Boats for fishermen refurbishment, repair or acquisition of small boats for subsistence fisherfolk through a fishing cooperative for economic recovery (details to follow).

All livelihood programs, if installed, will include training and recovery assistance from pig farming /agriculture and fish farming specialists from Iloilo/Philippine-based universities and research and development organizations (i.e. University of Iloilo, University of the Philippines and SEAFDEC)

SUGGESTED PROJECTS IN PREPARATION FOR FUTURE CALAMITIES

Estimated Total: (to follow, research currently being undertaken)

- 1. Two gasoline-operated Chainsaws
- because we have lots of trees in our town. Roads were quite impassable for 3 days for many tress have fallen by the roadside; which amour will keep and only lend to village if needed to avoid politicking and future disappearance of the equipment
- 2. Local training for weather forecasting
- weather risk mitigation and also to help cellphone owners to receive local alerts on their mobile phones of impending calamities
- 3. Direct Action Groups for community outreach in cooperation with the local government to educate and train at-risk communities in villages both coastal and inland in weatherproofing homes, survival strategies and disaster mitigation
